Our December 6, 2007 meeting will be at the Rattlesnake Club, the usual site of our meetings in downtown Detroit. It will feature John W. Farah, DDS, PhD a well known speaker and much published dental researcher as well as an avid runner (having completing over 94 marathons). Dr. Farah is a graduate of the University of Michigan. His degrees include a dual Ph.D. in Dental Materials and Aerospace Engineering, in 1972, and a D.D.S. in 1978. Dr. Farah taught at the University of Florida and the University of Michigan. Dr. Farah initiated THE DENTAL ADVISOR in 1983. He and Dr. John Powers are co-editors of the publication and work closely with approximately 300 dental professionals to evaluate and rate new products and equipment. In January 2006 he completed a new 11,000 square foot state-of-the-art testing facility in Ann Arbor, Michigan, to test and research the CAD/CAM ceramic products featured in THE DENTAL ADVISOR as well as host seminars and Continuing Education courses for dental professionals.
