### SECTION NEWS

#### WE FOUND OUT WHAT IS HAPPENING TO DENTAL INSURANCE

The practice administration section held its section meeting on Thurs March 29, 2007 at the Birmingham Athletic Club and hosted Kris Nicholoff Assistant Executive Director of the Michigan Dental Association, Carl Stoel DDS, Director of BCBS's Programs Administration and Caroline Ruddell, drafter of legislative and insurance advocacy for the MDA. The topic was "FIND OUT WHAT IS HAPPEN-ING AT THE AUTO TALKS"

Dr Stoel provided an overview of current dental insurance conditions in Southeast Michigan noting that most employers are trimming the cost of benefits provided. Since this is a most competitive marketplace with many potential dental benefit carriers, BCBS is simply following employer requirements when trimming benefit packages in order to retain market share. He did note however that BCBS has recently been able to conjoin a number of dental benefits with medical benefits especially if the dental condition is caused by or can be considered part of a medical condition. He listed a growing number of dental benefits that can now be paid under a patient's BCBS medical plan and are not subject to dental maximums or preconditions.

Kris Nicholoff suggested that currently the only way to improve the dental benefit packages provided by an employee's dental plan is to have employees ask their employers for better benefits. He noted that a significant percentage of our MDA dues go to marketing and public relations that attempt to raise the public's dental awareness and appreciation for quality dental care. He also said that the MDA committees would appreciate input from MDA members regarding current marketing efforts.

There was general agreement among the practice administration members present that the current MDA marketing efforts were "soft" and not as effective as they should be. Current efforts seem to make the point that dentistry is fun and easy and comfortable. A harder approach is needed. One that stresses the consequences of inadequate dental care; pain, tooth loss and especially one that publicizes the recent studies relating poor dental health to xerostomia, heart disease, diabetes, pancreatic cancer and other systemic diseases.

It was decided that the Practice Administration Section should compose a letter to all applicable leaders of the MDA detailing our concerns about the current MDA public relations and marketing campaign and suggesting a new direction in marketing. A direction designed to make the public understand that proper dental health is required to maintain good general health. The dentist is not just an extractor and filler of teeth who improves people's smiles but the dentist is a PRIMARY CARE PROVID-ER and dental health is a vital and an increasingly important part of overall good health and longevity!

We will keep you informed as to our progress.
